STAR services:

- STAR program services aim to address difficulties related to parent/child communication, problem-solving, decision making, managing peer pressure, coping skills, conflict-resolution, anger management and other client specific topics.

• Our STAR program is currently comprised of four fully licensed therapists and six professionally trained Family Support Specialists (FSS), al whom offer quality short-term and culturally sensitive services. STAR team members utilize evidence-based practices in conjunction with modalities such as Cognitive/Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (CBT/DBT), Solution-Focused Therapy, Trauma Focused-CBT and Motivational Interviewing (MI) to aid families, youths and children to overcome difficulties hindering positive and healthy development.
